It's approaching the time of the year when lightly chilled rose wines will be all the rage, especially those made in the dry, savoury style of this new release from a respected producer in McLaren Vale, South Australia. Made from the sangiovese grape – of Italian origin but very much at home in Australia – this is a delightfully drinkable new-wave wine, crisp and clean with strawberries and cream notes, savoury and elegant and extremely food friendly. Pair this with an antipasti plate or Lebanese feast.
