Deep garnet-purple in color, the 2012 7th Son Grenache Shiraz has a wonderfully fragrant nose of crushed red cherries and black raspberries with underlying spice box, bouquet garni and potpourri hints. Medium to full-bodied with lovely freshness and vibrancy in the mouth that is juxtaposed by a medium level of chewy tannins and racy acid, it finishes long. Drink it now to 2018.

A brand new Mitolo of 56% grenache, predominantly from 75 year-old Blewitt Springs bush vines. It's a wine of voluptuous, juicy, impeccable black cherry and black plum fruit, layered with liquorice, mixed spice and finely textured tannin structure. Bright, fruity and dripping with appeal, this blend showcases grand old vine fruit, framed sensitively in aged French oak.

From an excellent McLaren Vale vintage, this blend of grenache and shiraz with a splash of Italian variety sagrantino shows red cherry, plum and spice, with ageing in one and two-year-old French oak barrels adding structure. Enjoy over the next few years with beef or lamb dishes with a Mediterranean influence.

A grenache mix with shiraz and sagrantino, 7th Son has berry jam, spice, ink and meaty aromas that introduce a round, succulent palate of easy texture and soft grainy tannins.

Ripe and expressive, offering a full-bodied mouthful of red berry and black cherry flavors. The prune compote character, with lemon and spice overtones, informs the finish. Drink now through 2020.

A 56/40/4% blend of grenache, shiraz and sagrantino, the shiraz from Willunga, the grenache from 75-year-old vines in Blewitt Springs; the parcels spent 18 months in 1 and 2-year-old French oak, blended shortly prior to bottling. A totally delicious wine, the juicy red and black flavours spreading harmoniously through the length and breadth of the palate.
