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The nose is seductive, drawing the drinker into a world of sensuality (taste wise, that is). On entry, the flavours straightaway go downwards to dark, soft, velvet depths. All along the journey it gives, and as the journey can take as long as the drinker wants, it's gorgeous. 97 points and worth its \$80.

Inky colour and flavour. Coconut oak nestles into black berried fruit, the result intense in a cuddly way. That there is the main appeal, but it's not a one-trick pony: smoky, almost woody tones play along in the background, aided by sweet roasted nut characters. Upper echelon without a question.

Bright deep ruby hue. A bold, ripe and dense style with rich mulberry, chocolate and dark cherry fruit plus a touch of pepper spice. Dry, full bodied and plush fruit in a modern style and showing some very attractive spicy, violet lift and supple tannins. Surprisingly elegant in finish in a relatively early drinking style - delicious.

Deep garnet-purple in color, the 2013 Shiraz Savitar is youthfully subdued, revealing cedary notes over a core of crushed black and blue berries with hints of cloves and Provence herbs. Full-bodied with a fine foundation of grainy tannins and lively acid, it gives plenty of youthful fruit and good length.
