62% grenache, 33% shiraz, 5% sagrantino. Likely a wine to divide opinion. Essentially, it's more an exercise in savoury characters rather than being fruit-driven. Aromas of dried fig, old wood, dark chocolate and prune; the palate has deeply entrenched flavours of plum and berry, but they are hard to find within the tannin astringency which tends to dominate. The finish has a lemony quality which is a little challenging. The score probably sits on the fence.
